ONEIDA BAPTIST INSTITUTE AND KENTUCKY CHILDREN'S HOMES

We are collecting our offering for Oneida Baptist Institute and for Ky. Children's Homes. The offering collected will benefit TWO very worthy causes that involve our most precious resource-our children.

FIRST: ONEIDA BAPTIST INSTITUTE is located in eastern Kentucky, and was founded in 1899 to educate children there. Children from eastern Kentucky are still being educated by Oneida Baptist Institute, but it has broadened its ministry to include educating children from all parts of the world who need the kind of service provided by the caring staff at Oneida. They provided "more quality Christian education for less money" than any school heard about, and are truly a Christian school. Oneida is very deserving of our help — prayer, financial help and any other help we can give them.

SECOND: SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOMES is a ministry that grew out of the extreme needs present at the end of the Civil War. The Children's Home with which we are most familiar in this area is the one in Glendale. It was established in 1915. Sunrise is relocating its Spring Meadows and Glen Dale Children's homes to smaller, more efficient, self-contained facilities. The facilities are being upgraded in order to better minister to the abused and neglected children for whom they now care.
