As you know, I just finished a series of sermons about how the church grows. That series began with a message about God drawing people to salvation in His son Jesus and to full participation in His kingdom.</p> <p>Starting this fall and moving through next Easter, we will be making a concerted effort to draw people to Christ and His church. This effort is called "Find It Here". We will start by doing some prayer walking through specific areas of Hodgenville and the surrounding community. In the front foyer of the church you will find some sign up sheets for prayer walking in designated areas. I hope over the next few days that you will pray about taking responsibility for one of these areas. It would be good to have at least 3-5 people walking each area, the more the better.</p> <p>The purpose of the prayer walking is twofold. First it will raise our awareness for the lost in our community. Second, it gives us a chance to ask God to begin moving in the hearts and minds of spiritually needy people. As I said, I want to talk more about this on Sunday. But if you want to learn about prayer walking, then you may want to attend our annual associational meeting at Immanuel Baptist Church Tuesday evening September 29th. At the associational meeting there will be some break out training sessions specifically about prayer walking.
