The Lord recently brought a story to my attention that I had not studied for some time. It is found in 2 Chronicles 20:1-30, and I urge you to read the entire account of this incredible miracle of God!

Judah's king, Jehoshaphat, received word that they would be attacked by a great army. In response, he proclaimed a fast and gathered all the people to seek help from the Lord. As he stood at the temple in front of all the people, he prayed, *"We have no power to face this vast army that is attacking us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are upon You"* (v. 12).

The following verse tells us, *"All the men of Judah, with their wives and children and little ones, stood there before the Lord."*

The word of the Lord came to them, saying, *"Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's... You will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the Lord will give you... Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Go out to face them tomorrow, and the Lord will be with you."*

In response, the King bowed down with his face to the ground, and the people fell down and worshipped the Lord. Some stood up and praised the Lord *"with a very loud voice."* The King appointed men to sing and to praise the Lord *"for the splendor of His holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying: 'Give thanks to the Lord, for His love endures forever.'"*

I love the incredible lesson about the power of praising the Name of the Lord that we learn in verse 22: *"As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes against the men of Ammon and Moab and Mount Seir who were invading Judah, and they were defeated."*

Afterward, the people gathered to praise the Lord in a valley that they specifically named, "Beracah", which means, "praise".

How seriously do we take offering praise and honor and reverence to our Lord? May we seek to praise the Lord God Almighty just as His people did on that great day *"for the splendor of His holiness"*.
